Wednesday, July 14 – Saturday, July 17, 2010

1. Exhibits must be entered between 9:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon on Wednesday, July 14.
2. Entries are open to rural and urban noncommercial exhibitors.
3. Exhibitors are limited to **one entry** in each horticulture class and **one entry** in each arrangement class.
4. All flower exhibits, classes 1-29, must be in **clear**, stable containers.
5. No commercially obtained or artificial plant material may be exhibited in any class.
6. House plants must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for 3 months or more.
7. Judging begins at 1:30 p.m. Wednesday, July 14, and is **closed to the public**.
8. First (blue), Second (red) and Third (white) place ribbons will be awarded in each class, but only if entries merit placing.
9. Certificates awarded to all first-time exhibitors.
10. Release time for entries is between **3:00 and 4:30 p.m. Saturday, July 17**.
11. DeWitt Garden Club and the Fair Board are not responsible for theft or damage.
12. No noxious weeds permitted. See partial list below* or www.weeds.iastate.edu/reference/noxiousimages.shtml
13. All specimens should be identified.

*Noxious weeds include Artichoke, Buckhorn, Buckhorn Plantain, Bull Thistle, Butterprint, Canada Thistle, Cocklebur, Curly Dock, Field Bindweed, Hoary, Cress, Horse Nettle, Leafy Spurge, Multiflora Rose, Musk Thistle, Perennial Pepper-grass, Perennial Sowthistle, Poison Hemlock, Puncturevine, Quackgrass, Red Sorrel, Russian Knapweed, Shattercane, Smooth Dock, Sour Dock, Tall Thistle, Teasel, Velvetleaf, Wild Carrot (Queen Anne Lace), Wild Mustard, Wild Sunflower

Flowers: Best of Show chosen in Classes 1-29

- Class 1. Hydrangea, 1 stem, any color
- Class 2. Allium, 1 stem, any color
- Class 3. Coleus, 3 slips, each different
- Class 4. Coneflower, three blooms, any color
- Class 5. Black/Brown-eyed Susan, 3 stems
- Class 6. Daisy, 3 stems
- Class 7. Dahlia, 1 regular size with foliage
- Class 8. Dahlia, 1 small size with foliage
- Class 9. Gladiolus, 1 spike, any color
- Class 10. Lily, Asiatic
- Class 11. Lily, Oriental (Stargazer, Casa Blanca, Cobra, Crystal Pink, Gold Band...)
- Class 12. Lily; 12A-Day Lily, 12B-Tree Lily, 12C-Calla Lily, 12D-Trumpet Lily
(Display 1 stalk in each container.)
- Class 13. Marigold, Large, 3 blooms with foliage
- Class 14. Marigold, Dwarf, 6 blooms with foliage
- Class 15. Phlox with foliage
- Class 16. Pansy, 5 stems any color
- Class 17. Petunia, 3 stems single-flowered with foliage
- Class 18. Petunia, 3 stems double-flowered with foliage
- Class 19. Rose (standard), 3 blooms, any color with foliage
- Class 20. Rose, Hybrid Tea, 1 stem with foliage
- Class 21. Rose, Miniature, multiple blooms with foliage
- Class 22. Rose, Shrub with foliage
- Class 23. Snapdragon, 3 spikes, any color
- Class 24. Sunflower, 1 large, any color
- Class 25. Sunflower, 1 small, any color
- Class 26. Zinnia, 3 large blooms with foliage
- Class 27. Zinnia, 3 small blooms with foliage
- Class 28. Zinnia, 1 stem any color with foliage
- Class 29. Open Class, any suitable specimen not covered in classes 1-28

PLANTS: Best of Show in classes 30-36

- Class 30. African Violet, standard- or double-flowered
- Class 31. Succulent
- Class 32. Houseplant grown for bloom, must be blooming
- Class 33. Houseplant grown for foliage
- Class 35. Vining houseplant
- Class 36. Open Class, any plant not covered in classes 30-35, no pot larger than 12"

ARRANGEMENTS: Best of show in classes 38-46

- Class 38. Black container, flowers any color
- Class 39. Bouquet in an old fashioned style container
- Class 40. All green, container and arrangement
- Class 41. All white, container and arrangement
- Class 42. Container and flowers same color
- Class 43. Dried arrangement of plant material (no wreaths)
- Class 44. Arrangement in unusual container
- Class 45. Miniature arrangement, not more than 5 inches tall by 5 inches wide
- Class 46. Vertical arrangement

MINIATURE GARDENS: Best of Show in this class

- Class 47. Miniature garden, 5 or more rooted, live plants with decorative accessories in open container.
Minimum size 12" Maximum size 16"
